The "Continuing Their Journey" Program supports First Nations communities and Indian Residential School Survivors in projects directly related to the recovery of children and unmarked graves at former Residential School sites. These traumas are a direct harm that the Future Generations Foundation is committed to addressing with the Continuing Their Journey Program.


PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The CTJ program exclusively supports in areas of healing, specifically in response to burial sites and unmarked graves:

- **Survivor Support Groups**: Offering mental health support, healing journeys, ceremonies, and counseling.
- **Healing and Ceremony:** Facilitating healing circles, ceremonies, and reconciliation efforts.
- **Research, Engagement, and Knowledge Gathering:** Investigating IRS cemeteries and engaging survivors for knowledge sharing.
- **Memorialization and Commemoration:** Honouring children who died at IRS through memorials and commemorative events.
- Bringing Children Home: Locating, identifying, and repatriating children from marked and unmarked graves.
