On behalf of the Board of Trustees, the NIB Trust Fund is pleased to announce 41 individuals from the Northwest Territories were approved for \$206,000 in funding. The NIB Trust Fund was able to fund 93% of applications submitted from the Northwest Territories region. The applications were from Indian Residential School Survivors wishing to regain cultural knowledge and ceremonial teachings, traditional language learners, and students pursuing post-secondary education, certifications, and the trades.

The NIB Trust Fund is helping First Nations and Métis people continue our journey to revitalize language, culture, and bring healing to our communities. In the past year, the NIB Trust was able to invest in a wide variety of individuals education endeavours and advance the education and personal development of First Nations people in Northwest Territories.

With this additional support from the NIB Trust Fund, we provide an opportunity for university, college, trade and training school recipients in your region to focus on their goals and achieve success. You can find more detailed information on how the NIB Trust Fund is making an impact in Northwest Territories below.

The NIB Trust Fund offers two application opportunities; one for individuals where recipients receive awards, bursaries, and scholarships and another for groups and organizations where funding is distributed through grants and sponsorships. The next Call for Group and Organizations Applications opened November 6, 2020, and will close January 15, 2021.

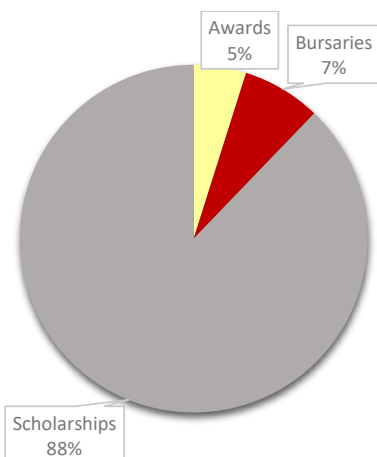
