The Future Generations Foundation is proud to announce the approval of \$2.68M in funding to Alberta. These funds are made possible through survivor funds, from the Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement (IRSSA). We support First Nations individuals and communities through comprehensive funding to strengthen cultural revitalization, healing, and educational initiatives in the region.

Over the past year, we have partnered with 16 dedicated organizations. These organizations are working to create and deliver impactful programs that are preserving traditional knowledge, uplifting youth, creating meaningful employment opportunities, and supporting healing initiatives across the region. The work of these organizations contributes significantly to our communities and the well-being of First Nations in Alberta.

Additionally, we celebrate the achievements of 122 remarkable individuals who have received educational support. From post-secondary degrees to professional development, language revitalization, cultural teachings, and on-the-land learning, these scholars exemplify the leadership and resilience that will shape the future of First Nations communities.
