These funds are made possible through survivor funds, from the Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement (IRSSA). We support First Nations individuals and communities through comprehensive funding to strengthen cultural revitalization, healing, and educational initiatives in the region.

Over the past year, we have partnered with 1 dedicated organization. Overall, funded organizations are working to create and deliver impactful programs that are preserving traditional knowledge, uplifting youth, creating meaningful employment opportunities, and supporting healing initiatives across the region. The work of these organizations contributes significantly to our communities and the well-being of First Nations in Nova Scotia & Newfoundland.

Additionally, we celebrate the achievements of 39 remarkable individuals who have received educational support. From post-secondary degrees to professional development, language revitalization, cultural teachings, and on-the-land learning, these scholars exemplify the leadership and resilience that will shape the future of First Nations communities.
